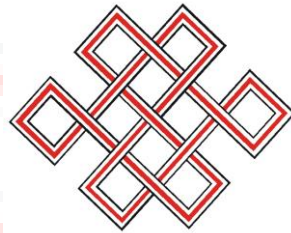

ANNUAL REPORT FOR CRY (CHILR RIGHTS & YOU) 2022-2023

Wide-Angle Social Development Organization had taken up a great initiative in association with the (CRY), Kolkata in educating 1000 children at 9 different AKCs in the operational areas of Imphal West district of Manipur. The team took a great effort in data collection, enrollment of the children and uploading them in a web portal. The AKCs teachers started their teaching at their respective centers from August onwards in full swing. The unenrolled children from the villages also received the teaching benefits. In the month of September, life skills were taught to the children referring to the CRY Module which included the topics like “Self-Empowerment Skills” consisting of the sub topic, “Self-Identity, Group Identity and Self-confidence” They were also oriented with the topic, “Menstruation” sensitizing them all the necessary information regarding period through discussion and explaining their doubts regarding the taboos, myths, PMS and solution to the period pains with the help of the comic (issued by CRY for reference).

AKCS teachers started teaching children in two batches in the month of October. 1st Quarterly Assessment of the 1000 children were conducted. During the month of November, they went door to door survey to reach out to maximum number of children to impart the education and helped in mainstreaming them. Also, to find out the reasons of the irregularities of children at the AKCs. The outcome of the survey was that more children of three categories like laggard, irregular and drop out were found out.

During the month of December, CRY evaluation was conducted with Ashim Sir, Mohua Ma’am along with the team at Langjing AKC and Salam AKC on dated 14th of Dec, 2022 and at Kachikhul AKC on dated 15th of Dec, 2022. A satellite Center was started at Karong village as the Atom Khuman AKC stopped due to the construction of the railway track near the southern part of the village. During the month of January, the AKCs teachers followed up the absent children at home due to extreme coldness to assist them in copying the missed lesson both at the center and at school. 2nd quarterly Assessment was also conducted. Data entering in Pragati was also resumed along with strengthening of VCPC in this month.

In the month of March, the AKCs continued the teaching learning process followed by improvement checking and providing the mainstreaming certificates of the children in coordination with the school authorities in the operational areas. Four days’ workshop was done at the premise of Wide-Angle Office from 14th of March to 17th of March, 2023 where teachers were given trainings on creating and making TLM support of the children. Annual Review was done from 20th of March to 23rd of March, 2023. It was an amazing learning experience for the organization as the CRY team had reminded the big picture of the project objectives and its result oriented. Soccer coaching has been started in two villages of Imphal West namely Yurembam and Maklang which is a great initiative taken by the organization in empowering the girls both physically and mentally.



Some of the major activities and events conducted during the year, 2022-2023 are listed as follows:

78 Parents, 29 Stakeholder and 4 School Authority meetings were conducted in the operational areas. The names of the villages and date of the meetings are listed below:

On 1st, 2nd, 8th, 11th and 13th of August, 2022- Parents meeting conducted at Kachikhul and Thaoroijam centers with 12 participants, Maklang and Thaoroijam with 17 participants each, Maklang (22 participants), Kachikhul (17 participants) and Atom Khuman (10 participants),” at Atom Khuman (12 participants), Langjing (15 participants), Ngairangbam (13 participants), Thaoroijam (7 participants) and Maklang (17 participants) and Patsoi with 5 participants for proper functioning of the AKCs and sending the children regularly at the AKCs.

- a) On 10th, 12th, 13th, 15th, 18th and 20th of September, 2022- Kachikhul (17 participants) and Salam (9 participants), Langjing with 5 participants, at Patsoi Part III with 16 participants, Ngairangbam with one participant, Atom Khuman (7 participants) and Ngairangbam (13 participants), Ngairangbam (15 participants), Atom Khuman (10 participants), Patsoi Part III (9 participants) and Salam (22 participants) with 18 participants each regarding the introduction of life skills and its importance so that children would cope up themselves at the time of vulnerable situations, reasons of absence at the AKCs and rescheduled of AKCs timing.
- b) On 7th, 11th, 13th, 14th, 18th, 20th and 21st of October, 2022- Maklang with 5 participants, Kachikhul with 6 participants, Ngairangbam with 10 participants, Tabungkhok with 5 participants, - Atom Khuman with 6 parents, Salam with 10 parents and Thaoroijam with 15 parents.
- c) On 5th, 7th, 14th, 15th, 18th and 20th of November, 2022- Patsoi with 11 participants, Thaoroijam with 8 participants, Maklang with 2 participants, Salam with 10 participants, Atom Khuman with 10 parents and Maklang with 2 parents.
- d) On 6th, 11th, 16th, 20th and 22nd of December, 2022- Ngairangbam with 15 participants, Maklang with (10 participants) and Thaoroijam (15 participants), Ngairangbam with 10 participants, Tabungkhok with 15 participants and Salam with 12 parents regarding shifting of AKC from Ngairangbam Makhaleikai to Ngairangbam Mamang leikai, maintaining the regularity of attendance at the AKCs.
- e) On dated 9th, 11th, 15th, 17th, 18th and 21st of January, 2023- Atom Khuman with 10 participants, Salam with (17 participants) and Thaoroijam (19 participants), _ Kachikhul with 9 participants, Maklang with 15 participants, Ngairangbam with 8 parents and Tabungkhok with 7 participants regarding preparation for the coming Final Examination and the 2nd Quarterly Assessment of the RILM(CRY) also to inquire about the reaction of the children to the satellite class.
- f) On dated 6th, 9th, 11th, 12th, 16th, 17th, 20th, 26th and 27th of February, 2023- Twice in Maklang village with 21 parents each, twice in Thaoroijam Village with 13 participants each, twice in Salam village with 18 participants and Kachikhul village with 15 participants regarding the improvement of children, rights & issues and its protection. Also tried to sensitize the parents about life skills and its importance in dealing with the children about their curiosity, doubts while dealing with vulnerable situation besides importance of games & sports in the form of free soccer coaching for girls only which will enhance their growth physically & mentally bringing gender equality and promoting self-wellbeing and self-protection.
- g) On 14th, 15th, 16th and 21st of March, 2023- Maklang & Yurembam Villages with 15 parents each, Langjing Child Friendly Center & Kachikhul Child Friendly Center with 9 participants each and Ngairangbam & Thaoroijam Villages with 10 participants each regarding the improvement, regularity and provision of mainstreaming certificates from the school authorities of the children. Trying to sensitize the parents promoting a free holistic space for girls in the form of Soccer Coaching for

girls only which will enhance their growth both physically and mentally thereby improving their self-well beings and self-protection.

- b) On dated 18th, 22nd and 25th of September, 2022- Thaoroijam village with MaibamMirabai Devi (Asha worker), Maklang village with Salam Santosh Singh (Club Secretary), KachiKhul village with Lukram. Iboyaima Singh (Club President), twice in Patsoi Part III village with HeisnamOkendro and Lanjing village with P.Pangalba (Club President) requesting the local leaders to initiate door- door survey and publicity to reach out to children and announcing the timings of the AKCs.
- c) On dated 7th, 17th and 19th of October, 2022- Langjing village with P Pangalba Singh (Club President), L. Bipindas Singh (Club secretary), K. Nishikanta Singh (Treasurer) along with 5 members of the club, Maklang village with Kh. Ranshing Singh (Ward Member), KachiKhul village with Iboyaima Singh (Club president) regarding the connection of light since the second batch of the center started at 6.pm in the evening and it was very difficult both for the teacher and children to manage the teaching-learning process, maintaining a neat and clean learning environment for the children at the center and also asking for co-operation in doing so.
- d) On dated 10th and 13th of November, 2022- – Patsoi Village with MutumSanatomba Singh, the club Secretary and at KachiKhul village with 7 club members and 3 local Meira paibis namely M. Jackson, H. Sachibala, Th. Merina, H. Alex, M. Bidya, L. Anilkumar, Th. Nganthoi, K. Roshita, S. Rohit and L. Olivia regarding the the door -to- survey along with the local authority to reach out more children both enrolled and unenrolled to receive the benefits of the program, monitoring, sensitized the importance of education in the area and on providing extra benches and desks for the center as some of the benches were old and had broken. Also, requested for the arrangement of additional blubs to be fixed at the center which they promised to do the needful as soon as possible.

Ketuki, at Heinoupok village with 16 participants who were the club leaders YCO (Youth Cultural Organization), Salam village with 3 club leaders, 3 AWWs and ASHAs and at Maklang village with 11 club leaders and 3 women leaders regarding the improvement of children in the AKCs and CNCP kept in a CCI, maintaining proper infrastructures at the AKCs, data collection of child detailed information and highlighting the prospects of the AKCs teachers running the free coaching and dealing in child protection and education.



- h) On dated 16th and 18th of March, 2023- – Langjing village with 4 club members namely L. Bipindas (General Secretary), M. Bhiego (Sports Secretary), T. Bogin (Ward Member) and L. Tonao (Club Member), atMaklang village with Kh. Ranshing Singh (Ward Member) regarding the improvement, regularity and providing mainstreaming certificates from the school authorities.

Major Staff Trainings and Orientations

- 1) On dated 12th, 15th, 20th and 26th of July, 2022- Orientation on staff schedules and meetings for good coordination and effective results keeping in minds of the main objective of the task were given by the project manager, Nanao Laishram with 11 participants. She further gave a briefing on maintaining the various registers namely attendance, visitor, staff movement and meeting - minute.Introduction of life skill, its awareness, its application in life, problem solving, realistic goals and expectations, mainstreaming and protection through life skill, “Who am I “, self and group

identity, self-confidence were oriented by the resource person, Soma Das (CRY) with 12 participants each from Wide Angle and Niets. Training on the life skill was again given by the project coordinator with teachers, staffs (11 participants), and other agency (Mirage with 4 participants). A small briefing was also given on the various terminology of meetings like workshop, consulting, interface and one-one etc. Orientation on the role of a teachers, their challenges in monitoring the children, teachings, internal assessment and mainstreaming were given by a resource person, Sayantani Das (CRY) with 12 participants.



- 2) During the month of September, all the teachers were given an opportunity to learn more on life skills through all the modules. The Project Coordinator, Nanao Laishram had capacitate the team as well as the teachers from 9 centers with each module of the life skill. She re-oriented on the concerned context and how to take sessions with the children at the centers. She also shared the simple activities where we could easily make the children understand the concept of Self and Group Identity.
- 3) On dated 6th, 7th and 24th of October, 2022- A staff training and orientation was done at the Wide-Angle Office. There were also two intern students from IGNTU (Mr. Namshim Pamei and Miss. Gainlung Kamei). The Project coordinator shared the various social issues and briefing was done on child issues. Another training was done at the office along with staffs, teachers, two intern students from IGNTU and Superintendent from Aura organization, Miss. Rebecka Kshtrimayum as guest. The training was on the topic, “Proactive thinking” and also continuation of the child issues and child protection. A briefing was also taken on how to take assessment of the children at the centers and proper maintenance of all the different registers by all the concerned teachers.
- 4) On dated 19th, 25th and 26th of November, 2022- A staff training and orientation was done at the Wide-Angle Office. The whole office staffs, center teachers and the two intern students from IGNTU

(Mr. NamshimPamei and Miss. Gainalung Kamei) were participated in the trainings. The Project coordinator shared the history of Wide-Angle Social Development Organization as per the personal request of the intern students. She also gave a briefing of the various initiatives and programs taken up by the organization for a social cause and helping the society. Another training was also done at the office along with staffs and teachers to arrange a door- to-survey to the operational area to bring maximum numbers of children to the center both unenrolled and enrolled children. Also, to find out the reasons of irregularity of children at the centers. An orientation was also conducted by the project coordinator on child related issues and child protection.

- 5) On dated 12th and 13th of December, 2022- A staff training and orientation was done at the Wide-Angle Office by the Project Coordinator, Nanao Laishram as regarding the preparation and grooming of the teachers for the coming CRY evaluation. The teachers were asked to give self-introduction so that they got the confidence and could speak fluently while interaction and discussion. Various child related issues and the probable solution that would be done in terms of cases were also discussed.
- 6) On dated 2nd, 16th, 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th of January, 2023- A training was done at the Wide-Angle Office by a resource person, Nongmaithem Gautam Singh (Primary teacher of Ideal High School, Govt. of Manipur) regarding the making of TLM (teaching learning materials) with the locally available materials and cost cutting which will be child friendly and handy to use. Also oriented us how we are going to make a child friendly games and environment which will make learning with fun for the children. Collage making activity with the children and used as TLM. Bulletin Board should be introduced where children are allowed to paste their skills in the form of painting, essay, poetry, banner etc which will help them to find their passion and also boosting their passion. He also grooms the teachers regarding class transaction by various methods like dramatizing the lesson, pup petting, storytelling and singing songs. He also briefed about circulation of benches grouping of children with different skills which will enable the children to learn different skills through sharing. Teaching with examples in connection with socio- cultural background of the community. Classroom activity using small concept and easily understandable medium before going to larger formulas and concept. He also suggested that children should be allowed open door learning with games, singing and activity on the lap of nature. Another training on Trauma Counselling by an expert Shamal Sarkar from T.I.S. S (Tata Institute of Social Sciences). She oriented regarding basic ecological model where the children directly or indirectly interact like family, neighbors, school, mass media, society, community service, culture, custom & laws which shaped and molded their learning aspects, risks & protection factors and Psychosocial support as well. She emphasized on creating a comfort and safe environment, emphatic & effective communication while dealing and responding to a child to win trust and for a good rapport build up without discrimination and being judgmental respecting the views of the child.
- 7) On 21st and 25th of February, 2023- Training conducted at wide angle premises by the project coordinator, Nanao Laishram promoting the TLM by joint cooperation of all the team members sharing their ideas and creativity in making the TLM with the easily available local materials like card board, newspapers waste, bamboo etc. On line joining of the refresher session of Post Life Skills Assessment by Sir Sourav (CRY).



8) On dated 14th, 15th, 16th and 17th of March, 2023- A 4 Days workshop on TLM was done at the Wide-Angle Office along with the staffs and center teachers where the teachers were further oriented about the importance of TLM which will enhance the learning capacity of the children in an easy way in relation with the local environment like introduction of open learning where the children could identify the different leaves and also parts of the plants at the center areas. All the teachers showed their enthusiasm and their hidden passions while making the TLM for the children with sharing of different ideas and creativity amongst themselves. The teachers were further oriented about the mainstreaming of the Children's certificates and information of the enrollment of the drop out children in the new sessions.

A Short Report of the Essay and Drawing Competition

An essay and drawing competition were conducted at all the nine centers in celebration of the "Patriots' Day" on dated 13th of August, 2022. It was really an excited and fun for both the teachers and children at all the nine centers. There were 56 children from an age group of 8-16 years. The project coordinator had given a briefing on dated 12th of August, 2022 at the office to all the teachers of how we were going to conduct the competition and all the necessary items like crayons, chart papers, pencil and eraser were distributed to the teachers so that they could give to the children in their respective centers at the time of competition. The essay competition was conducted at Salam Child Friendly Center and 10 children had participated in it. They had written the essay on both English and Manipuri. We had seen that many of them were really creative and had expressed the great sacrifices by the great leaders of Manipur like Bir Tikendrajit, Thangal General and Paona Brajabashi. The teachers and frontline staff along with the children also flung our "Tri-color Flag" in the air in all the respective 9 centers. A beautiful Manipuri patriotic song, (Sana Leibak Manipur) was also sung by the children on this particular day with a sense of belongingness and heartfelt tributes to all the great souls of Manipur who sacrifice their lives for the motherland.



After the competition was over, the respective teachers in each center along with the project manager had chosen the best children as 1st, 2nd and 3rd position and prizes were distributed by the project coordinator. The children were very happy as well as the parents who were present on the event to support and encouraged their children in the respective 9 centers. The parents also showed their gratitude for the wonderful experience.

INTRODUCTION TO LIFE SKILL ASSESSMENT

Life Skill assessment was conducted with the randomly selected children by (CRY). Twenty-four (24) children altogether participated in the assessment. Questionnaire were distributed to the children and the respective teachers of the centers translated whenever required by the teachers. The duration of the assessment was 20 minutes. The team along with the project coordinator also visited the centers to coordinate and assist the teachers while taking the sessions.

A SHORT REPORT ON ASSESSMENT

All the 9 centers have taken a quarterly assessment for all the children and also for the unenrolled children who came to the additional learning whom the teachers at the centers also taught them together with the enrolled children. The assessment was taken on Manipuri, English, and basic calculation. The questions were prepared by the teachers which again was sorted out and finalized by the project coordinator. As reported by the teachers, most of the children in all the centers were doing well in Manipuri with letter identification, reading and writing as well. Few children were little slow in reading sentences. More practices and classes were required for English although they were good in letter identification. Sentence reading and paragraph reading is bit slow with children. They learnt about word reading slowly and the teachers were taking extra efforts in teaching and helping them in word making and sentence reading.



A short report on the opening of Satellite Centre

As the classes at the Atom Khuman AKC were stopped due to the construction of the railway track near the southern part of the village. Many children were shifted to the nearby village at Karong with their relatives so that they could do the preparation for the Final exam. The environment was so polluted and the roads were really dusty and unfit even for walking besides breathing problem not only for the children but also for the whole villagers. It was even worse in rainy days. The transport system for private carrier like auto were also in less frequency. Villagers had to wait for long hours to catch it. Therefore, in the best interest keeping in mind for the development and progress of the children, the team had started a satellite center at the Karong village as there were enrolled children of the village who went to KachiKhul AKC. So, it became convenient for the both the children of both the villages to continue their learning at the Karong AKC (Satellite centre). There were also many children from the Karong village who were not enroll were also allowed to join the class.

A BEGINNING OF BETTER ENVIRONMENT WITH CARE & SUPPORT

An initiative taken by the team for the upliftment of a CNCP child namely Nelson Soraisam of the KachiKhul AKC who is a drunkard single parent child. He also got separated from his mother four years back as she was mentally unstable and stayed in her maternal home with her parents. Nelson got a trauma at a very young age of 3 years. He was beaten up severely even got a bruise on his left legs as reported by the local elders when the team went for a field visit at the village. He cried whole night waiting for someone to take care and support him as his father did not return home that too at a very young age when he was not even 7 years at that point of time. He missed his mother to put him in a sound sleep singing lullaby. He even did not have a slipper to wear in this severe winter and when the team asked about this, he narrated that his father wore it. He also told us that he took away his other basic amenities like shoes, socks, sweater etc. It was really saddening to watch him in that condition. He was referred to a shelter home in the past years which was really a horrible experience for him. He was asked to gather firewood and even fetch water at midnight. He was given different sorts of errands which he had to do without complaining. When the team were approached by the father and local stake holders of the club to keep him in a shelter home, he fled away at the first time. We searched for him and finally got the chance to know about all those bad experiences and childhood trauma that he had experienced so far. The team approached and fixed a meeting with the child help line and he was counselled by the expert for his own development and progress with assurance of providing love, care & support in the best and safe environment where he could be himself with that child innocence and provision for learning new ideas and knowledge which will help him in the future. With the initiative of the team and stake holders of the village, the child was produced to the CWC, Imphal West District on dated 26th of December, 2022. The committee discussed thoroughly with the father, the team and the stake holders most importantly with the child and asked about his decision which really matter the most. With an open discussion followed by a common resolution, the child was sent to CCI in Tabungkhok with new hopes, dreams and visions for a better future in the safe environment.

A short report on the process of formation of VCPC

The team is really doing its best in visiting different villages in the operational areas (Imphal West) fixing meetings with likeminded Stakeholders, MairaPaibies, Anganwadi Workers, Asha workers and parents for the formation of VCPC in the respective villages for the welfare development and protection of the children.

A Short Report on the Networking & Alliance Meeting for Likeminded Stakeholders

One Day Networking & Alliance Meeting for Likeminded Stakeholders was held on dated 9th of February, 2023 at the Conference Hall of Wide-Angle Social Development organization for strengthening rapport & cooperation amongst the key stakeholders in the operational areas (Imphal west). The meeting was grace by Hon'ble Chairperson of Manipur State Commission for Women, Ulka Salam as Chief Guest, Imphal Times, Editor, Rinku Khumukcham as Guest of Honor. Special invitees namely Mala Lisham, Project Officer, State Child Protection Society (Social Welfare Department of Manipur) and Y. Indramani Singh, District child Protection Officer (Imphal West) as resource persons of the said program. There were 34 participants in the meeting.

The program started with the registration of the participants at 10:30 AM which was followed by a welcome & key note address by Montu Ahanthem, the Secretary of Wide-Angle Social Development Organization. Some of the sharing of working experiences & challenges faced by the participants, various probable solutions while facing the challenges were highlighted below:

Ulka Salam (Hon'ble Chairperson of MSCW)—She shared her personal experiences of child related issue due to separation of parents due to marital conflict while working in the Bishnupur District. She pointed out the emotional turmoil of the child who was not allow to stay with the mother effecting the development of the child and psychologically as well. She believed in common concern rather than conflict in solving and finding a resolution of marital issues. She also stated the role of a women for preserving the culture of a society. Most of the cases in the MSCW were women related issues like domestic violence, abuse, ill treatment, marital issues etc. Some of the challenges she faced while working were the “customary laws versus legal laws”, “rigid rules & laws versus human values”. She also reflected her opinion for trust, accountability, convergence, interaction among different stakeholders, different departments were best methods for networking to resolve any social issues and to bring larger productivity and development to the society.

- 1) Rinku Khumukcham (Editor, Imphal Times) --- He shared of reporting child rights & child related issues in media. He pointed out that reporting should be done in a child friendly manner in case of dealing with the survivor (UN CONVENTION) to build trust with the child. In sensitive cases, women journalist should intervene in interviewing the child. He also shared that only 5% were reported on child development while 81% were reported on child issues to capture the targeted demands of the readers more focusing on the survivors of the crime. He recommended that every newspaper should had a column for motivational stories of the survivors, their success & struggles

from child related issues. Some of the challenges in media were lack of trained journalist, less salary and many also migrated to different states for better opportunity. He also shared that he took part in one of the programs on Mission Pad Shala as an anchor and reflected that there was very less budget at the policy level although there were many women & children related crimes reported.

- 2) Mala Lisham (Project Officer, SCPS, Social Welfare Dept. Of Manipur) ---She started with the topic of “Role of Social Welfare Dept. & Building Alliances with Likeminded stakeholders”. She shared her personal working experiences of different child related issues like molestation in Tengoupal District. Many reported cases of CNCP at the border areas due to Foreigner Act sending them to CCI. She also narrated that some of the police station could not even file a FIR in case of POCSO. She also cited that many challenges were faced during her initial stage working in the field due to different opinions between stakeholders resulting to conflicts rather than focusing on common concern and the best interest of the children. She recommended a manual development at the policy level for cybercrime & cyber safety.

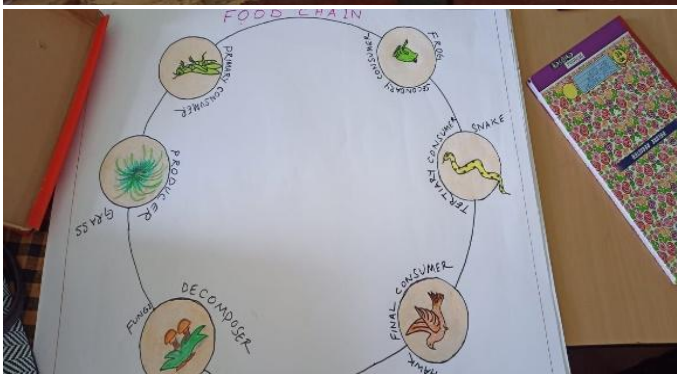
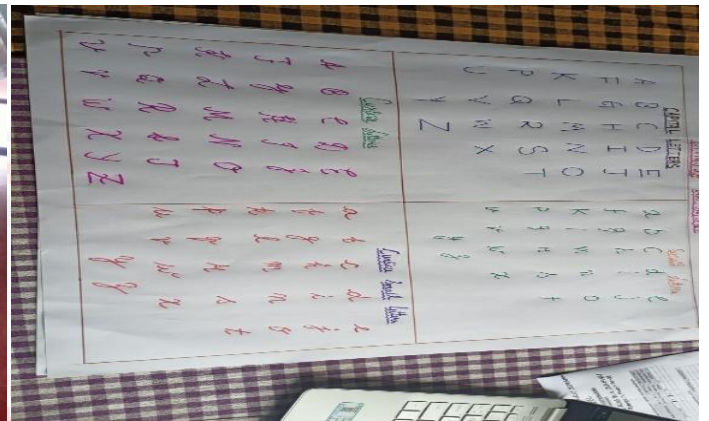

He also shared that Wide Angle organized a health camp in order to know the physical status of the clients as well as their spouses and children and give a counseling on the ill effect of drugs and how they can prevent from HIV/AIDS. He further highlighted the services available in the DIC and requested all the participants to take the services and also shared to all those who are known to them. So that we can jointly root out issues of drug and HIH/AIDS.

During the camp the medical team of MLSS, Khuyathong, Imphal west conducted HIV testing and counseling to all the participants. Besides testing our doctor also examine the health check-up to all the participants and our organization also provided some common medicines like vitamin, calcium dropper for children, appetizer etc.

Mrs. Seilema ANM gave a vote of thank. In her vote of thank, she shared that in the future also all the participants who are present today will support and take the services available in the DIC. She also thanks the community members to support our camp.
